Class signups are done at the time of camp registration! Attached to this camp form are the details. Camp forms will not be accepted without the class sign up ranking form!

PARENTS: Campers should have input on their class rankings!

<u>Where:</u> North Central 4-H Camp, Carlisle, Kentucky. The camp is owned & operated by the University of Kentucky <u>Who:</u> Camp is open to Campbell County youth, age 9 through 14. You do not have to be a 4-H member.

<u>Transportation:</u> All campers are transported to camp on school buses. We leave from Campbell County High School, 909 Camel Crossing, Alexandria.

Camp Fee: \$150 for each camper.

\$50 deposit per camper will hold their spot. Make check payable to: Campbell County 4-H Council *No refund will be given if less than a week's notice is given for cancellation. All cancellations must be made through the Extension office during office hours (M-F, 8am-4:30pm)

<u>Deadline:</u> Forms & camp fee balance is due **no later than May 6.** This will be strictly enforced!

Space is limited! You can send your camp form & money in PRIOR to the deadline.

Camp FAQ's (Frequently Asked Questions)

What's 4-H Camp like?

A typical day begins with wake-up around 7:30am and a yummy breakfast. Everybody pitches in after breakfast to keep the camp in tip-top condition. Campers gather around the flagpole for morning flag raising and singing. The morning is filled with fun classes. In the afternoon, campers join friends for swimming, free-time, educational activities, and recreation. After supper, everyone comes together for the flag lowering ceremony and night activities such as field games, recreation, and dancing. Cabin lights are turned off around 11:00pm.

Where do we sleep?

In <u>air-conditioned</u> cabins! There is a cabin area for boys on one side of the camp and a girl's cabin area on the other side. Each cabin holds 14-21 people. At least one adult and two junior counselors (age 15-20) stay in every cabin. Most of the campers in your cabin will be around your age or from your school. If your friend is attending camp be sure to put their name on the appropriate line on the camp form so you can be in the same cabin.

What classes can I choose from?

Campers sign up for classes BEFORE we get to camp. Be sure to complete the Class Ranking form attached to the camp packet. Each class meets for about one hour on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. Classes may include canoeing, nature, recreation, crafts, archery, riflery, foods, swimming, outdoor living, and challenge course. Other special classes may include disc golf, soccer, crafts, yoga, and sand volleyball.

What about the food?

The food is good- scrambled eggs, French toast sticks, biscuits & gravy, pizza, turkey, chicken strips, tacos, pancakes, cheeseburgers, tater tots, salad bar, and fruit. We have white & chocolate milk machines at camp and cereal at EVERY meal! There is also an afternoon and evening snack each day.

What is the First Year Camper Event?

This is an event just for campers who have never been to 4-H Camp before. It is not required. Campers who are there will watch a slide show about camp, meet some counselors, learn some line dances & songs, and have a chance to answer any questions they may have about 4-H camp. A light lunch will be served for the 12-2 session. Parents are encouraged to drop off their camper and come back to pick them up. Two sessions are offered: 7/2 from 12-2pm OR 7/2 from 6:30-8:00pm. First year campers only attend one of the sessions.

Are there scholarships available to help with the cost?

There may be some money available to help with the camp fee. We ask that you pay at least half of the camp fee. You can also check with your school's Family Resource Center or Youth Service Center for possible assistance. Call the Extension office at 572-2600 if you have questions.



Kentucky 4-H Camping Code of Conduct and Expectations

- 1. Campers are not permitted to bring cell phones to camp.
- 2. Possession or use of alcohol, illegal drugs, or weapons by any person is prohibited.
- 3. Use of tobacco products is not allowed for campers/teens at 4-H camp. Should a county decide to permit adults (21 years and over) to use them, it may occur only in areas designated by the Camp Director. Absolutely no tobacco products are to be used in cabins, woods or non-designated areas of camp.
- 4. Camp participants are permitted to enter the cabin in which they are assigned. All other cabins are restricted.
- Campers are not allowed in the cabins during a class or activity. If a camper is ill, they are to stay at the medical center (not in a cabin) until the Health Care Provider (HCP) feels the camper may return to activities.
- 6. Camp participants are to be attentive, responsive and courteous to any staff, adult or teen counselor making a presentation before the group.
- 7. Absolutely no phone calls are to be made by campers (camp office phone or cell phone) without approval of the County Extension Agent. All County Extension Agents should be informed of incoming calls at the camp office to campers.
- 8. Accidents or illnesses, no matter how minor, are to be reported to the County Agent and Camp Healthcare Provider. If medical care is needed, the Agent will coordinate treatment with the Camp Healthcare Provider.
- 9. Obscene, discriminatory and/or inappropriate language or dress, roughhousing, and insubordination is not acceptable at any time and may result in dismissal from camp.
- 10. Fireworks are not to be used by camp participants at any time.
- 11. Swimming, boating, or any waterfront activity is not permitted except during designated times and under proper supervision.
- 12. Appropriate dress, including footwear, should be adhered to as outlined in the 4-H Camp Dress Code.
- 13. Camp participants are always to remain with their groups, and must obey the rule of 3 when traveling. Individuals are not to be on the trails or near the lakes without an accompanying adult.
- 14. Camp participants are not permitted to leave the grounds at any time without notifying and receiving approval from the Contact Agent and their County Extension Agent.
- 15. Camp participants are expected to be in their cabins, with lights out, as designated on the camp program schedule.
- 16. No visitors, other than parents or immediate family, may visit campers during the camp. Visits must be approved in advance by the County Extension Agent.
- 17. No camp participant is to be around or on maintenance equipment.
- 18. Camp participants who are having personal conflicts with others should discuss these with their cabin counselor, dean, or County Extension Agent.
- 19. Campers and teens are to work with counselors in carrying out daily assigned jobs to help keep the camp running smoothly. Grounds are to be kept clean at all times. Camp participants are expected to leave the cabins, facilities and grounds clean and orderly.







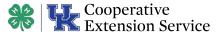
- 20. Camp participants are to respect camp property. Any misconduct resulting in damage to camp property or buses, including graffiti, shall be paid for by the camp participant and/or parent or guardian. A list of damage fees is available.
- 21. All medications must be turned in to the designated adult and picked up by the parent/guardian at the bus pick up site. The Health Care Provider will be responsible for securing all medications at camp.
- 22. Camp is not responsible for personal property of any camp participant or staff.
- 23. We care about the safety of all camp participants. Incidents of serious misbehavior (i.e. threats, fighting, bullying, causing injury, alcohol/drug incidents, any altercations between adults and/or minors, intentional property damage/vandalism, etc.) will be reported to the Camp Director and County Extension Agent and an incident report will be completed. Incidents of serious misbehavior may result in dismissal from camp.
- 24. Camp participants should demonstrate respect toward others. Bullying, hazing, or pranks (i.e.: shaving cream, toothpaste in pillow/sleeping bags, defacing property, including inappropriate use of electronics/social media) will not be tolerated and may result in dismissal from camp.

Any conduct inconsistent with the above rules may result in consequences such as the camp participant/parent/guardian/immediate family member being sent home, restricting future participation in 4-H activities, termination of 4-H membership, or other consequences determined by the county's or state's policy. If a camper must be sent home, it will be the responsibility of the parent/quardian to pick them up at camp. There is no refund of the camp fee for an early departure.

Kentucky Residential 4-H Camp Essential Standards for Camp Participants

It is the policy of the University of Kentucky, Kentucky 4-H and the Kentucky 4-H Camping program to encourage and accept participants without regard to race, color, ethnic origin, national origin, creed, religion, political belief, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, pregnancy, marital status, genetic information, age, veteran status, or physical or mental ability. Parents/Guardians of children who have medical conditions or other disabilities requiring special attention should alert the agent to ensure proper care and accommodations are provided. If the camper requires personal care or a level of attention not available through camp staff or volunteers, a family friend or relative of the same sex over age 18 or a parent/guardian must accompany the child as a caregiver. The parent/guardian will agree to pay the individual costs of the caretaker (25% of the camper registration fees.) The Client Protection Process will be performed on the caretaker with favorable results.

To determine whether a caregiver should accompany a camper, the following factors will be considered:

- Ability to dress without assistance
- Ability to maintain personal hygiene, e.g. bathing, brushing teeth
- Ability to attend to toileting needs
- Ability to understand and follow oral or written instruction
- Ability to remain at rest or sleeping according to the camp schedule
- Ability to participate in group activities with minimal individual attention
- Ability to participate in a communal living environment with minimal individual attention
- Ability to sustain a 15-hour (7am-10pm) camp day with limited rest periods
- Ability to understand and respond to dangerous conditions
- Ability to take medications according to a pre-set schedule and with minimal assistance

If a caregiver is not provided and a camper cannot meet the essential standards listed above, they may be dismissed from camp. If a camper must be sent home, it will be the responsibility of the parent/guardian to pick them up at camp. There is no refund of the camp fee for an early departure.

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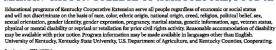

<u>Advanced Swimming</u>- Participate in water activities/games; Use diving board <u>Archery</u> - Learn archery safety and basic skills; Use archery equipment at range <u>Backyard Games</u> - Learn basic skills and participate in games at the Backyard Games area at camp (Gaga Ball, Carpet Ball, Basketball)

Sand Volleyball - Learn basic skills & participate in games!

Beginning Swimming - Learn basic swim techniques; Participate in water games **Board Games** -Come cool off in the dining hall and play some fun board games!

Let's Read! - Bring a book & spend the class period relaxing & reading!

Canoeing - Learn canoeing safety, basic skills, and water games

Camp Crafts -Make some awesome crafts! Be creative!

Yoga - Exercise, Stretch, and practice Yoga moves

Fishing - Learn fishing safety and basic skills, Fish at the lake

<u>Foods</u> - Learn basic food preparation skills and create your own snack foods <u>Friendship Bracelets</u> -learn how to make these popular bracelets for yourself, friends, and family!

Disc Golf -Throw a disc at a target, get points, and that's the fun game of Disc Golf!

<u>Easy Art</u> – Make some art projects to take home.

<u>High Ropes</u> - Learn rock climb wall safety and skills for climbing; Learn zipline safety; Climb 40-foot mock rock wall and zipline down on the other side

Kavaking - Learn kayaking safety, basic skills, and water games

<u>Low Ropes</u> - Participate in low rope elements not far from the ground, while working as a team to complete challenges (examples: rope bridge crossing, bridge balance, rope spider web activity, and many more)

<u>Nature</u> - Learn about nature as you take hikes on the trails around camp <u>Outdoor Living Skills</u> - Learn how to build and cook over campfires; How to

build shelters; Get an intro to wilderness first aid

Recreation - Learn and participate in various games and camp dances

Riflery - Learn rifle safety and basic skills; Use equipment at range

Soccer - Learn basic skills and participate in soccer games

<u>Ultimate Frisbee</u> - Learn basic skills and participate in games (The game uses a disc that is passed from team members using only a few steps at a time to get the disc over the goal line)

<u>Hand Sewing & Embroidery</u> - Campers will learn a few embroidery stitches to create their own fabric art to bring home and display! A bit of patience is required, but a lot of fun will be had!!

Wood & Leather Crafts - make some cool wood & leather items to take home
