

he Kentucky State Fair runs August 15 -25, 2024 at the Kentucky Fair and **Exposition Center in** Louisville, Kentucky. Gates open at 7 a.m. each day. The Kentucky State Fair is a tradition for generations of

families across the Commonwealth and beyond.

The State Fair offers lots of educational and entertaining exhibits, fun filled attractions, top of the line concerts, a World's Championship Horse Show, rides and my favorite- the fair food. There are also plenty of other activities all designed to create memories for friends and families. All of the concerts are free with paid gate admission.

The Kentucky State Fair hosts 4-H projects from across the state in "Cloverville." Cloverville is the village-like area where all non-livestock 4-H Exhibits are displayed during the fair. Cloverville consists of 18 divisions where 4-H'ers can showcase their projects.

In order to exhibit a 4-H project, 4-H'ers must first qualify on the county level. Kentucky 4-H believes that all youth should have opportunities for positive youth development in four guiding concepts: mastery, belonging, independence and generosity. The Kentucky State Fair 4-H events demonstrate a 4-H'ers level of mastery in project work through completion of displayed items.

Cloverville is located in the South Wing of the Kentucky Fair and Exposition Center and will be a part of the fair's AgLAND Exhibit. AgLAND will include more than an acre of agriculture exhibits which will highlight Kentucky's farm and field heritage, including the future of farming and agribusiness through H and FFA exhibits. AgLAND is brought to you by Kentucky's Farm Families and the Kentucky Department of Agriculture.

So why not plan a trip to this year's Kentucky State Fair? The Kentucky Fair and Exposition Center is one of the 10 largest facilities of its kind in the US. It features 1.3 million square feet of contiguous exhibit space and includes about 30 acres that are under roof and air conditioned. You can visit the website to see the daily schedule and maps. There is also an App and it has Twitter, Facebook and Instagram accounts for the most recent updates.

4-H Camp 2024


This was our 2nd largest county camp attendance on record!







4-H Youth Development Code of Conduct Form

All 4-H members and family/friends/caretakers associated with 4-H members must respect the individual rights, safety and property of others and adhere to this Code of Conduct. A 4-H member may be prohibited from participating in a specific event/program if the participation by the individual poses a danger to the 4-H member and/or others. Safety of all involved in 4-H programs is top priority, the following guidelines are designed to ensure all involved understand their role in participating in a safe and educational environment for all.

WHILE ENROLLED AS A 4-H MEMBER:

- To be a member in good standing it is expected that the 4-H participant attends planned sessions, workshops, field
 trips, and meetings associated with their enrollment. To be eligible for cumulative events in 4-H, members must
 complete at least six hours of education in the core program area they are participating in under the expectations laid
 out by the 4-H program.
- Dress codes will be specific to individual events/programs/activities.
- The possession and use of alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, vape juice and/or devices, and/or drugs (except for
 medications prescribed to the participant by a licensed physician, with proper paperwork and accommodations made)
 are prohibited.
- Possession of firearms not for educational use is prohibited.
- · Setting of fire alarms and tampering with fire extinguishing and other emergency equipment are prohibited.
- Gambling of any type is prohibited.
- Respect toward others and facilities shall be demonstrated. Bullying, harassment of others or destruction of property shall not be tolerated. Bullying and harassment can include the use of social media.
- Physical violence is not tolerated.
- Obscene, discriminatory and/or inappropriate language, roughhousing, and insubordination are prohibited at all times.
- Display of overly affectionate or inappropriate attention between participants is prohibited.
- Technological equipment (including but not limited to cell phones, laptops, or mp3 players) shall not interfere with the
 program and may not be allowed in certain situations.
- Articles of clothing which display profanity, products, or slogans which promote tobacco, alcohol, drugs, sex, or are in any other way distracting, are prohibited.
- Additional expectations may be required based on the activity/program/event the 4-H member is participating in.

WHILE ATTENDING OVERNIGHT 4-H EXPERIENCES THE FOLLOWING WILL ALSO APPLY:

- All participants must follow the agenda and expectations that are set forth by the program planners. Chaperones/adult volunteers will actively monitor all participants.
- All participants are to be in their assigned area at curfew and comply with quiet hours, lights out, and other rules of the
 event. Chaperones/adult volunteers will actively monitor all participants.
- No member or volunteer may leave the event/activity/program without the permission of the event planner or adult in charge. An adult shall accompany a 4-H member at any time they leave the grounds. Adults shall notify another adult before leaving the grounds.
- At overnight events, only conference participants may be in sleeping areas. Individuals may only be in their assigned sleeping area. Lounges or common areas may be used only for working committees and social activities.

Any violations of this Code of Conduct shall be reported promptly to the chaperone for the individual and to the person in charge of the event. The person in charge of the event shall have the final responsibility for disciplinary action. Failure to comply with the Code of Conduct by 4-Hers and family/friends/caretakers associated with the 4-H participant may result in penalty including, but not limited to, the following:

- Sent home from the activity or event at their own expense.
- Barred from participation from future 4-H events.
- Assessed the cost of damages for destruction of property.

KEEP MOVING!



hen summer break ends and you go back to school, you probably spend more time sitting and less time moving. During the summer, you had more time to swim, play outside, and take trips to the park or gym.

But just because school is back does not mean you should stop moving! In fact, the more time you spend moving outside of school, the more you will be able to pay attention and do well when you are in class. You may have to try harder to be active, but it is worth it!

Here are some ideas for staying active once school starts:

- Start your day with slow stretches, or a guick warm-up.
- If you can, walk or ride your bike to school or the bus stop.
- If you get recess or a break during the day, use that time to move!

- Sign up for a sport or club after school that gets you moving. It can be fun to try something new. Or ask a friend to join you for an activity that you enjoy.
- Make a habit of taking a walk or bike ride with your family after dinner.
- Have a nightly dance party at home.
- Chores can keep you moving too! Volunteer to help rake leaves, vacuum, or walk the dog.

If you want to try something new, here are some sports and activities you can try:

- Pickleball
- Ice skating
- Archery



- Yoga
- Gymnastics
- Golf

Keep your screen time in check, too. It can be easy to spend the whole evening after school in front of the TV, playing video games, or on a tablet or phone. Try to keep the time you spend on all devices to less than 2 hours each day. That includes time at school. Talk to your parent or caregiver about when you would like to watch your favorite show, play a game, or use an app. Then set a limit on how much time you spend. Also, decide how you will know when that time is up. Using screens right before bed can make it harder to fall asleep. So, leave screen time out of your bedtime routine. End your day with something that makes you feel calm and relaxed, like reading, listening to music, praying, or thinking about the best part of your day.
