#### Campbell County 4-H Saddle-Up Club Show Rules

1. Campbell County Saddle-Up Club, leaders, CCAS Inc., Northern Kentucky Saddle Club, and/or representatives are not responsible for accidents and/or loss of equipment.

2. Photographs of participants and spectators may be taken during the horse show and may be used by Campbell County 4-H for promotional purposes in print and on the world wide web.

3. Registration booth opens 1 hour before the show starts. Registration for the first 5 classes closes 15 minutes before starting time. Once the show has started, changes may be made up until the class prior. Tack change is limited to 5 minutes and horse/rider must be in consecutive classes.

4. Show management may cancel any classes at their discretion and/or if conditions are deemed unsafe. 5. Show management reserves the right to combine classes for any class that has less than 3 participants and switch classes from field arena to main arena.

6. Show management reserves the right to limit the number of classes a single horse enters (single or multiple contestants using the same horse)

7. Entry Fee is \$7.00 per class unless otherwise noted plus a \$3.00 gate for per horse. Current negative Coggins, valid health certificate and proof of flu/rhino vaccine are required for showing.

8. No refund after a contestant has entered a class unless the class is cancelled or suspended by Show Management. No fee may be switched to another class.

9. Ribbons and Payback: Classes with added payback (\$50 and \$100 added classes) require 10 entries for added payback. All other classes will receive payback with 6 or more entries. Ribbons and payback are available at the registration table. Please pick these up at end of show. Any unclaimed ribbons and/or payback will be considered forfeited.

10. Kentucky 4-H State rules apply, except for those classes marked OPEN or SCHOOLING. Club Walk-Trot rules apply for walk trot and pee-wee classes.

11. Judge's Decision is Final. Judge decides if a horse's body condition score is appropriate to show.

12. Proper attire is required for all classes. ASTM-SEI helmet is required with safety strap fastened for all riders/driver 18 years & under (as of January 1, current year), when mounted/driving on show grounds. Boots required. All participants & judge will follow dress code of state rules except for contest riders (at club show only). Contest riders may wear a short sleeved collared shirt (button down or polo). No T-shirts. No sleeveless shirts. Shirts must be tucked in. No mid-torso showing.

13. Open Class dress code - same as above except for participants 19 years and older (as of January 1 of current year) are strongly advices to wear and ASTM-SEI helmet.

14. Riders/Drivers age of January 1, current year, determine class eligibility. Junior riders (9-13) may not ride in upper age categories and Senior riders (14-18) may not ride in lower age categories. If classes are combined due to small class size, age groups will be judged and awarded separately.

15. Walk-trot: (CLUB RULE) is open to 9–18-year-old participants. Participants are only eligible for Walk Trot designated classes. They may show in "OPEN" in hand classes. If the horse breaks into a "Canter" participant must show effort to bring the horse back to a 'trot'. If the participant can't get the horse back to a 'trot' in 3 strides, they will be placed below all contestants that remained at a 'trot'. Pee-Wee Classes are for those participants below 9 years old. Participants may not cross enter pee-wee and walk-trot classes.

16. Contest showmanship class - horse and rider must be entered together in other contest classes.

17. No Stallions; no exceptions. Uncontrolled or sick horses will be asked to leave.

18. No alcohol. No glass bottles of any kind. Dogs must be always on a leash and if found unrulily or aggressive towards people or animals, you will be asked to leave. Proper etiquette required at all times.



# BEING ACTIVE KEEPS YOU HEALTHY



ou may have found that sometimes it is hard to sit still — in class, at home, or at a meeting. That is because your body is made to move! Being active, moving your body in different ways, is one way to be healthy. Kids and teens should try to get at least 60 minutes — 1 hour — of physical activity every day. play tag on the playground at school, attend a team practice or game after school, or take a walk with your family or pet in the evening!

#### There are three different kinds of activities:

- **1. Activities that strengthen your bones:** These are things like walking, hiking, jogging, climbing stairs, playing highimpact sports like tennis, and dancing.
- 2. Activities that build your muscles: These are things like swimming, bicycling, lifting weights, or exercises like pushups, situps, and squats.
- **3.** Activities that make your heart beat faster: These are things like running, jumping rope, dancing, rowing, using an elliptical, or playing high-intensity sports like basketball or soccer.

#### There are many reasons why being active is good for you. Some benefits of physical activity include:

- Having more energy and feeling good
- Being able to sleep well at night
- Feeling self-confident
- Being able to focus and pay attention





June 10th is National Family Health & Fitness Day. Plan for how you and your family can be active together! You could choose an activity that everyone enjoys, or let each person pick their favorite and take turns doing different activities. There are so many ways to be active and fit!
